

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT August 5, 2024 – September 30, 2024

A School Resource Officer Program will be established with the Franklin County Schools, the Franklin County Commission and the Franklin County Sheriff's Department.

The Franklin County Sheriff's Department shall provide one School Resource Officer for the Franklin County School System.

The Franklin County School System, the Franklin County Commission and the Franklin County Sheriff's Department will be responsible for the salary of \$6,004.57 for Charles Hamby and divided as follows:

Franklin County Schools - \$6,004.57

Franklin County Sheriff's Department – Gun, Ammunition, Taser, Car, Fuel, Benefit Package and Required Training.

The School Resource Officer will divide time equally among the schools in Franklin County, or per request of the Superintendent of Education as specifically assigned.

The School Resource Officer may not be called away from the school setting to address other law enforcement issues.

The School Resource Officer must complete SRO Training, NARSO approved. The School Resource Officer must have completed Active Shooter Training. The School Resource Officer shall not act as a disciplinarian.

The School Resource Officer shall become familiar with all Board of Education Policies and the Code of Student Conduct.

The School Resource Officer shall act as and be considered a school official for searches and seizures based on reasonable suspicion authorized by New Jersey vs. T.L.O.

The School Resource Officer shall take law enforcement action as required.

The use of confidential school records by the SRO shall be done as allowed under the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act.

The Franklin County School System, The Franklin County Commission and the Franklin County Sheriff's Department agree to cooperate in good faith in fulfilling the terms of this agreement. Unforeseen difficulties will be resolved by negotiation between the Superintendent of Education and the Franklin County Sheriff.

RESOLUTION

A RESOLUTION REGARDING APPROPRIATION AND EXPENDITURE OF OPIOID SETTLEMENT PROCEEDS

WHEREAS, the Franklin County Commission has received (and will continue to receive), certain settlement proceeds (the "Settlement Proceeds") pursuant to resolution(s) with certain defendants involved in the MDL opioid litigation (the "Litigation"); and

WHEREAS, the Settlement Proceeds must be expended pursuant to the terms of two agreements (the "Settlement Agreements" attached hereto as Exhibit "A") which aim to address the opioid epidemic and local governments efforts in combating the same; and

WHEREAS, although the Settlement Agreements vary slightly, they all generally require funds to be sent to address three broad categories of abatement: education, prevention, and treatment.

WHEREAS, Franklin County Commission desires to expend the Settlement Proceeds pursuant to the Settlement Agreements and in compliance with applicable Alabama law.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, Franklin County Commission does hereby resolve to appropriate and to thereafter expend a portion of its Settlement Proceeds pursuant to the below.

Section 1. Franklin County Commission shall expend a portion of the Settlement Proceeds as follows:

I. Enforcement / Education

The settlements contemplate expenditures of Settlement Proceeds toward ongoing governmental efforts related to the enforcement and education. The following expenditures are proposed by Franklin County toward enforcement and education efforts:

1. Allocation to the Drug Court Programs:

The Franklin County District and Circuit Judges (34th Judicial Circuit) operate multiple drug/alternative court programs. Each of these courts provides education and treatment for people with opioid and other drug addictions. Franklin County agrees to allocate to each such court the sum of six thousand and no/100 Dollars (\$6,000) for the first year and then four thousand and no/100 Dollars (\$4,000) for the following four

years, subject to the County continuing to receive said opioid funding or otherwise having the same available for allocation. Said monies shall be used in the education and treatment of individuals suffering from opioid related drug addictions.

Section 2. All laws and regulations will be followed related to the procurement of the aforementioned items which will enhance the County's and Sheriff's offices ongoing efforts to promote the enforcement of drug/ opioid related laws, improve education and training for law enforcement and the general public, and enhance treatment for opioid affected individuals.

Section 3. Should any portion or provision of this Resolution or the expenditures contemplated herein be deemed illegal or unconstitutional, the same shall be stricken from the Resolution without affecting the balance of the same or expenditures contemplated herein.

Resolutions as follows:

RESOLUTION

A RESOLUTION REGARDING APPROPRIATION AND EXPENDITURE OF OPIOID SETTLEMENT PROCEEDS

WHEREAS, the Franklin County Commission has received (and will continue to receive), certain settlement proceeds (the "Settlement Proceeds") pursuant to resolution(s) with certain defendants involved in the MDL opioid litigation (the "Litigation"); and

WHEREAS, the Settlement Proceeds must be expended pursuant to the terms of two agreements (the "Settlement Agreements" attached hereto as Exhibit "A") which aim to address the opioid epidemic and local governments efforts in combating the same; and

WHEREAS, although the Settlement Agreements vary slightly, they all generally require funds to be sent to address three broad categories of abatement: education, prevention, and treatment.

WHEREAS, Franklin County Commission desires to expend the Settlement Proceeds pursuant to the Settlement Agreements and in compliance with applicable Alabama law.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, Franklin County Commission and Franklin County does hereby resolve to appropriate and to thereafter expend a portion of its Settlement Proceeds pursuant to the below.

Section 1. Franklin County Commission shall expend a portion of the Settlement Proceeds as follows:

I. Enforcement / Education

The settlements contemplate expenditures of Settlement Proceeds toward ongoing governmental efforts related to the enforcement and education. The following expenditures are proposed by Franklin County toward enforcement and education efforts:

1. Drug Enforcement Unit Equipment

The equipment is used to make criminal cases on sources of supply in Franklin County who distribute and traffic drugs- certainly including opioids. This equipment will be used not only to combat the opioid epidemic but will have a purpose in training and educating law enforcement and ultimately the general public with the use of data obtained. This data is used daily to educate and update law enforcement on the new

developments in the drug community and give law enforcement information to disseminate to citizens on the dangers of opioid abuse and its negative effects.

2. Drug Enforcement Unit Surveillance and Equipment Trailer

The Franklin County Sheriff's Office provides case management, training, and education for local law enforcement on drug investigations that include opioids and other dangerous drugs. Opioids and other dangerous drugs negatively affect our community in many ways that have resulted in opioid addictions and the rise in drug overdose deaths.

II. Treatment

The settlement Agreements contemplate expenditures of Settlements Proceeds toward ongoing governmental efforts related to the enforcement and education. The following expenditures are proposed by Franklin County toward enforcement and education efforts:

1. Medical Sensors for Inmate Holding Cells

Unfortunately, but indisputably, a significant number of inmates are drug addicts with opioids being one of the prime culprits. Often, inmates will still have effects of these drugs in their system at the time of arrest creating tremendous risk to the inmate. Non-wearable vital sign monitoring systems measure respiration rates and heart rate. By using radar technology to take continuous vitals without staff intervention, the system provides reliable and accurate healthcare monitoring for these at-risk inmates and will allow the correctional care entity hired by the County to provide immediate healthcare support for inmates who may overdose or have other adverse health-related effect from the adverse health impacts of opioid abuse. The system would be an important and vital health tool for at risk inmates.

- Section 2. All laws and regulations will be followed related to the procurement of the aforementioned items which will enhance the County's and Sheriff's offices ongoing efforts to promote the enforcement of drug/ opioid related laws, improve education and training for law enforcement and the general public, and enhance treatment for opioid affected individuals.
- Section 3. Should any portion or provision of this Resolution or the expenditures contemplated herein be deemed illegal or unconstitutional, the same shall be stricken from the Resolution without affecting the balance of the same or expenditures contemplated herein.
